



## “Who Do You Think You Are?”

**Start with a few questions to get everyone talking. Choose questions that will work well with your group or family.**

Talking through the message during the week helps you turn what God is saying to you into a life that centers on Jesus. These talking points, questions and scriptures are designed to help you take the next step. If you are leading a group through this guide, pick out the questions that will stir up conversation and action among your group. If you are doing this study on your own, why not journal or write out your thoughts.

- How would you describe what an ambassador is?

Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21. Paul tells us in this passage that we are all Christ’s ambassadors.

- What ministry has God appointed you to do? If you don’t know, what ministry do you think He may be calling you to do?
- How did God make His reconciliation with you?
- How do you see yourself as an ambassador of Christ?
- What does being “in Christ” really mean?

Read John 15:16-19, Acts 9:15, John 6:38, 1 Peter 2:9-10 and 2 Corinthians 10:8. These verses show the four qualities of being Christ’s ambassador.

- How should knowing that you are chosen by God to be His ambassador influence your actions and the way you see yourself?
- Why do we so often put our agenda ahead of God’s?

- What does it mean to you to carry the authority of heaven?
- In what ways could you be a better representative of Christ?

### **NEXT STEPS**

Here are some specific things you can do this week that will help you embrace the fact that you are an ambassador of Christ:

- To understand you are in Christ, read the book of Ephesians this week and highlight all the places that Paul uses the words “in Christ.” As you read, take time to really look at what God’s Word says about who you are because of your position in Him.

### **TALK IT OVER WITH GOD**

- Thank God for reconciling you to himself.
- Praise Him and tell Him how much He means to you.
- Ask God to show you ways you can become a better ambassador for Him in your daily life.
- Ask God to show you the ministry that He is calling you to carry out. Commit to taking your next step in embracing your ministry.
- Commit to God that you will strive to place His agenda over your own.
- Ask God to show you who you really are in Christ.
- Thank Him for making you the unique person you are!
